The Frank Lloyd Wright-designed Monona Terrace is a curvilinear gathering place linking Lake Monona to the Wisconsin State Capitol. It is a semi-autonomous operation of the City of Madison. Monona Terrace has been a leader in testing and adopting sustainable best practices which are then applied to other City operations. The building has maintained LEED Best Practices continuously since 2007 when it became the first convention center ever awarded LEED Silver certification. Monona Terrace was awarded the higher LEED Gold level recertification in November, 2015.

The executive management asserts the importance of maintaining the building certification under the LEED Rating System as a key management and marketing tool to help maintain the competitive advantage Monona Terrace holds in its market. Monona Terrace is also an active member of Travel Green Wisconsin which focuses on environmental sustainability in the travel and tourism industry.

Monona Terrace contracted with Leonardo Academy to provide the guidance needed to streamline achievement of LEED-EB recertification at the Gold level. Leonardo Academy

provided consulting services to update all plans, policies, audits, and best practices to meet the current rating system. The project had a twelve-month performance period from May 16, 2014 to May 15, 2015.

Sustainable Achievements

Participating in LEED-EB and achieving LEED-EB Gold certification has produced many concrete benefits including:

- Energy Ratings: An Energy EUI rating 27% below the national average for convention centers..
- Water Use: Water use reduction 46% below the LEED benchmark.
- Greenhouse Gas Emissions: Tracked, recorded, and reported greenhouse gas emissions generated by the building
 and grounds through Leonardo Academy's Cleaner and Greener® program.
- Green Cleaning: Refined green cleaning program serving as a model for other City of Madison cleaning operations.
- Waste Streams: Diverts the building's waste streams through a revised waste reduction, salvage-repurposing, and
 recycling program that includes all ongoing consumables, durable goods and equipment, compostables, and preconsumer food waste.
- Native Plantings: Maintains native plantings over a 22,646 square foot area of roof gardens.
